This working group was established to help the EuroMarine network develop an active Young Scientist community capable of engaging and exchanging with each other and the wider EM member network, providing inputs on the future direction of the network, as well as deriving maximum benefits from the current and future network activities and services.









A Bottom-Up Approach

- Launched a call for members (Feb 18)
- 18 early career scientists from Member Organisations in 13 countries initiated WG



- These young scientists were asked to selforganise and develop their own ideas for establishing a permanent working group.
- Regular meetings were held, and communication support was provided by EuroMarine Comms.


Achievements
